Procedure	
7. Wrap the cuff of the sphygmomanometer around the bare arm, with the bladder centred over the brachial artery and superior to the elbow (Marieb and Hoehn [160], Patton and Thibodeau [211]). The lower edge of the cuff should be 2-3 cm above the brachial artery pulsation (O'Brien et al. [206]).	Show
2. Check the unit of measure and ensure that it is reading in mmol/L prior to each use.	Hide

Units of measure may change from mmol/L to mg/dL, which could result in the meter user thinking that the blood glucose level is higher than it actually is (MHRA [175], C).

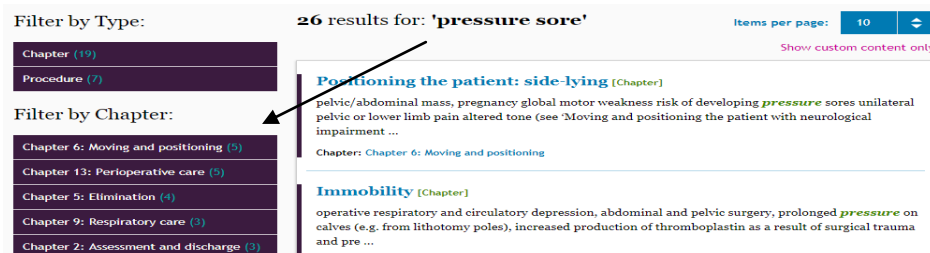
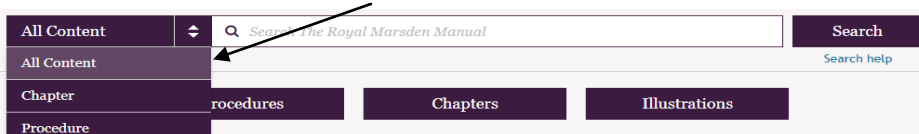

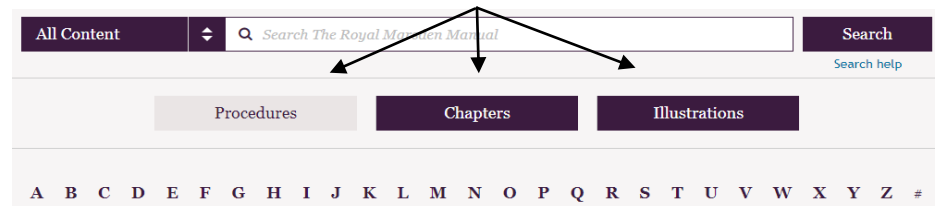
Diagram of the foot	Fri, Jan 12, 2018

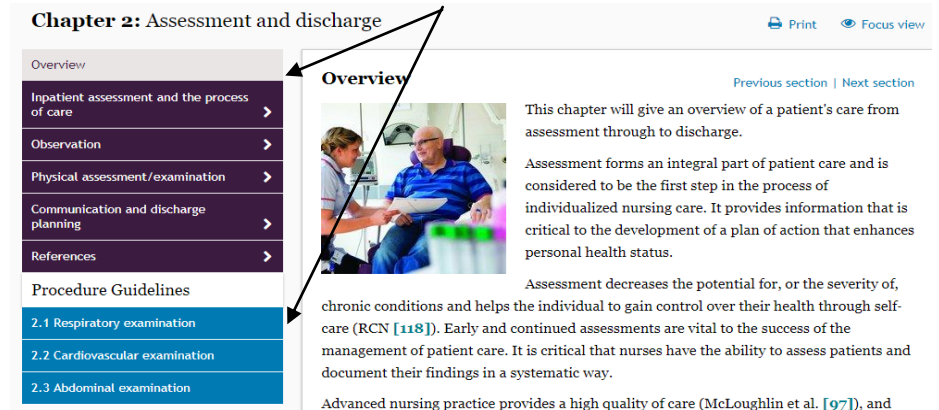
